Dear Friends

As the winter continues, with cold mornings and dark evenings and we seem to be surrounded on all sides by coughs, colds and flu like bugs that are difficult to shift, it can be easy to feel down and to want to stay snuggled up warm under the duvet or on the sofa in front of a fire. It can be hard to find things to look forward to in January and February, the summer seems so far away, journeys to family and friends are more difficult with the shorter days and icier conditions and many of us have less available cash following from our Christmas celebrations and Valentine's Day can remind us of love we've lost and relationships that aren't as we had hoped. We have red letter days, black Fridays and now blue Monday as we recognise the way our monthly and seasonal routine impact upon our mental health and well-being.

Everyone has good days and bad days and there are plenty of stories in the Bible of people struggling with their mental health (Elijah suffers from depression, several of the psalms talk about being in the pit of despair, Jesus heals the Gerasene and restores him to his right mind). In days gone by it was difficult to admit to people that you were finding life difficult, feeling low, lacking energy, being inexplicably irritable or feeling depressed, stressed or overly anxious. Thankfully times have changed and we recognise that mental health and well-being is a spectrum and we can find ourselves in different places on it at different times in our lives and that most people (possibly as many as half of us) will at some point benefit from help and support and the opportunity to access talking therapies through our GP.

If you or someone you love is struggling this time of year, don't bear it in silence, there are people who would love to be there for you, your family, friends, GP, the church. Being part of a community, having places to go and people to see can help as can having the opportunity to talk about the things that really matter to us.

This month the churches are launching two new initiatives which we hope will bring people together, enable us to build new friendships and create opportunities for us to listen to one another and offer warmth, welcome and support. The first is a community soup lunch on the second Wednesday of each month at Holbrook Moor Methodist church and the second are two Lent discussion groups, one daytime and one in evenings - you'd be very welcome to come along and see whether you might want to get involved.




Everyone is welcome to gather together as members of the local community to meet new people, support one another and share homemade soup accompanied by bread rolls, fruit, cake and hot drinks.
